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Preface



Hello Referees/Friends-

We can't stress to you enough how important it is for you to review this manual. Everything you need to know about getting started, including getting certified and re-certified every year, getting up and running assigning matches to yourself, getting set up in league systems, recording scores for competitive matches, getting paid and much, much more are all in this manual. If it's not covered here and we receive a question on it then we add it to the manual. We've added tips and tricks we've learned along the way to help you be a better referee. We want everyone to succeed and have a fun time doing it!

The table of contents should be an easy way to navigate the document. We try to keep everything in a logical order so if you've already skipped past it go back and take a look. If you're viewing the electronic version of this document, click on the page number in the table of contents to take you right to the information you need.

We are trying to streamline the process for all referees and give the clubs and leagues a better way of managing their coaches and team managers. Other assignors are taking note of what we are doing. As we have additional assignors joining the group we will add their club information. You can easily tell who the assignor is for the match by clicking the "I" icon next to the match.

We think that it is very important to pay referees through GoPay. We believe that this ensures that everyone gets paid properly. We've had instances of referees not being paid at the fields properly and it creates a huge administrative headache on our end. We understand that instant gratification is important to some younger referees. In these cases, we suggest that perhaps they work out a loan with their parents and have the money from GoPay go straight into the parents' bank account. For those of you that are patient and don't need the loan, GoPay provides a built-in savings method for you. If you are working enough matches to require a 1099 at the end of the year, we suggest that younger referees discuss doing their own taxes with their parents. Filling out a 1040 EZ is a great learning experience and you likely aren't making enough money to be taxed if you file your taxes yourself. Talk to a tax advisor, but once you have documented income you are eligible to contribute to an IRA. Perhaps a crafty parent would want to gift their child a small amount equal to their earnings to go into a retirement account. Think of the growth over a 40+ year period. Again, talk to your tax advisor, which we are not.

We hope you find everything we are doing useful and have a great experience with the systems we are putting in place. Feel free to reach out with any questions, but first... Please read the manual!

Insurance

Any matches that are not USSF are not insured. This means that when you step on the field as an independent contractor to do a match you are not financially covered should something very bad happen to a player. You MUST have separate insurance. League matches for NISL, IWSL and YSSL are covered under USSF insurance. Most tournaments, unless otherwise noted are covered under USSF insurance. Any friendlies (which includes "Summer League"), pre-season or **recreational leagues** are not covered under USSF because they are not affiliated matches.

Midwest Referee will be purchasing insurance for you for all non-affiliated matches. The insurance for you as an independent contractor will cost \$15 and will be taken out of your payment at the end of the season. Your insurance is good from the time it is purchased to the last day of the year (12/31).

General Guidelines

This is a self-assign system based on a rating you have been given. You will see matches that you are able to sign up for. If you're not seeing all of the matches it's likely because your date filter at the top isn't set correctly. It defaults to dates in the past. If you set it to display the entire year (1/1-12/31) you should see all matches for the year. You could also be looking in the wrong group. Make sure you go to "My Assignors" under "Personal Info" and click "Switch" next to group. Matches will be posted once we receive them from the league. We will send out an email when they are ready for taking.

If you are an experienced referee and only prefer to center we understand, but please consider taking an AR position occasionally to help us out with assignments and to mentor other referees.

Please make sure you are accepting/declining any assignments promptly. When details about a match change (ie. time or location) your status will change from accepted to assigned and you will need to accept the match. This tells us you have seen the change. As we get closer to a match we will need to remove you from the match to find someone else if you haven't accepted. It's much easier if you accept/decline it right away.

Please keep your availability up to date on the site so that we can see who is available to work open matches. This comes in very handy and makes things run much more smoothly.

The general rule of thumb is that you need to be 2 years older to center and same age or older to AR. Please also take into consideration the match level if you are a younger/newer referee. The difficulty rating we've assigned to you should take this into consideration, so you should only see the matches you are eligible to sign up for. If you are not eligible for the match you will see [TBD], likely because you would be eligible to AR if the position were open.

If you can't make a match, please don't find your own replacement and not notify us. If you do find a replacement, all the better, but let us know who it is so we can update the site. This also goes for signing up for matches and handing them off to other people. That can't happen.

If you are assigned to a match you should be the referee working the match.

Remember to arrive at least 15-20 minutes before match time.

Remember to look the part and you will garner more respect from players, coaches and spectators Have all of your proper gear. Reminder of things that everyone should have:

Black shorts

Black Socks (pulled up)

Flags

Whistle and cards if center

Jersey tucked in with multiple colors so you can change in case of conflict.



Pens/pencils and paper to write on

Wristwatch with timer - not a stopwatch around your neck and definitely not an iPhone

If we find that referees are abusing the system they will be removed and not asked back. We don't ever want to have to do that so please remember to do your best to follow the guidelines.

Please also refresh yourself on the laws of the game before your first match. Remember to try to learn something from more experienced officials at each match. If you're new let them know that and they will help you with the basics first.

This is a job so we must be professional at all times, but it's a fun job so have fun doing it!

Getting Started


Join the Midwest Referee group

If you already have a gameofficials.net account, skip to the next section.


No gameofficials.net Account

If you don't already have a GameOfficials.net login, click on the green hyperlink in the upper left corner that states "New Official?" If you already have an account with another group (ie. NISL) log in and see the next step below.






Fill out your profile information as thoroughly as possible. If you don't know your USSF ID you can leave it blank (see below).

Already Have an Account, but need to join the group?

If you already have a gameofficials.net account, you can log in and click on "My Assignors" on the left menu under "Personal Info". The click on "(Show)" to the left of "Join New Group"

In Either Case...

We will receive notification that you've joined. Once we activate your account you will be able to see available matches and sign up for them.

USSFID

Sometimes it takes a few months after you receive your badge for US Soccer to add you to their system and create your ID. Once it has been created you can look it up on your profile of the US Soccer Referee training site. Once you have your USSF ID be sure to update it in gameofficials.net.

Change Identity

Once you have joined the group you can switch between groups by either using the My Assignors link and clicking the switch link next to the group (see in image two above) or by clicking the Change Identity link on the lower left menu. Change Identity also allows you to switch between groups in a similar fashion.



If you center for NISL you will need to join the NISL group to report your scores. To sign up for that group follow the same process, but use the group number 1444 and access code NISL2015. Instead of using the old process of looking up a match in NISL's old referee system you will report your scores in this group to get paid.

Work Permit

If you are under 16 you will need to get a work permit. Please see the news items for the most recent version of the letter needed to obtain a work permit. You will not see any matches in the group until we get a valid work permit that is specific to Midwest Referee.



Uniform


There are links on MidwestReferee.com in the getting started section under Uniform to get great deals on the required uniform. The shirts are almost identical to other brands, but don't have the US Soccer logo on the shoulder. We think you'll like the pricing.

We suggest Yellow, Green and Blue if you're only going to buy three shirts. This is what we've always suggested and ensures that all three referees have the same color shirt to change into in the event of color conflict with the teams. You should never have the same color on as either one of the teams. The reason there are five colors is because you also don't want to conflict with the goalkeepers. If you can only afford three shirts we'll let it slide at this level, but as you start refereeing higher level matches you should consider using the money you've earned to buy five shirts. Ten (long sleeve) if you want to stay warm in the cold!

Payment and Score Reporting

There is no score reporting in the recreational leagues. Please sign up for a GOPay account in GameOfficials.net in order to get paid. The rec leagues will be paid at the end of the season via GOPay. We suggest connecting a bank account or a pre-paid credit card for them to deposit money directly because it's free and VERY convenient. They charge an outrageous amount to mail a paper check (currently \$6). To sign up for GOPay click on the "My Payments" link under "Personal Info" in the left menu. Once you have set up GoPay and a payment has been made, click on My Payments to view your payments, add a bank account and set your preferences for payment frequency. If you've set up a bank account we suggest selecting "Daily" as you will get our money the same business day it goes into your GoPay account.





Taxes (W-9 is not a 1099)

Anyone that pays you needs a W-9 such that if they're ever audited, they can report the earnings to the IRS. If you make over \$599 you will receive a 1099 from that entity and should report it on your taxes. IWSL and YSSL collect your social security number and generate a W-9 when you sign up on their site. NISL and Midwest Referee are not that sophisticated yet and need a paper W-9. You can email a photo of the W-9 or mail it if you prefer.

Midwest Referee W-9

Some matches are paid out by Midwest Referee at the end of the season. This includes all of the rec league matches, all 4v4 matches and ARs for some clubs. We use GOPay built into GameOfficials.net to pay out. The only thing we need from you is a W9. If you've already sent us this in the past, no need to send it again. We only need it once. Please email the W-9 to MidwestReferee@gmail.com with the subject "W9 - [Your Name]" so it will go to the correct place. If you don't want to email it you can mail it to us at the address on the form.

NISL W-9

NISL pays via GOPay in gameofficials.net on a regular basis. If you haven't sent them a W-9 you will get a notice that there is a tax hold on your payment. You need to email a scan of a completed W-9 to Philip Richardson (philip@chicagosoccer.com) and sign up for GoPay on gameofficials.net

Recreation Leagues

A rec league is a great place for new referees to gain valuable experience and get paid a decent rate for it at the same time. Matches are typically played on Saturday morning and early afternoon, with a few matches played during the week. If you are an experienced referee your experience is very helpful with getting new referees up to speed. We would greatly appreciate your help even if it's only for a day or two.

If you want to see the rec league matches you need to add yourself to the rec league. It's very simple to do. Navigate to "My Info - My Preferences" and under "Leagues" check the box next to both rec leagues and click Save. You will then see the matches under self-assign.

All of the rec league matches are paid out at the end of the season by Midwest Referee. See W-9 section above.

Please see the additional posts regarding the rules for each rec league. Make sure you know any special rules of the league you will be working for.

Elk Grove Rec League

The rates for this season will be as follows:

Kindergarten - Center: \$25 1st, 2nd & 3rd grade - Center: \$30 4th & 5th grade - Center: \$35

6th & 7th grade - Center: \$40; AR: \$25

Medinah Rec League

The rates for this season will be as follows:

U10 Center: \$35 U12 Center: \$40

U14 Dual Center: \$40



WSA Rec League

The rates for this season will be as follows:

Micro 1 and 2 (1st-2nd grade or U7/8) - Center: \$15

Junior (3rd-4th grade or U9/10) - Center: \$25

Intermediate (5th-6th grade or U11/12) - Center: \$30; AR:\$15 (2 man: \$30 each)

Senior (7th-12th grade or U13+) - Center: \$45; AR:\$25 (2 man: \$45 each)

Please call the rainout hotline at (630) 206-1722 when the weather is poor to determine if your match is canceled. You can also download the rainout line app which is very convenient (http://bit.ly/WSARainout) or subscribe to text/email messages on that same page. We will also cancel the matches on the site as soon as we're aware.

Competitive Leagues

This applies to NISL, YSSL and IWSL.

AR Pay

Each club can determine how much they would like to pay ARs. We have suggested amounts, but it is ultimately up to the club. Some clubs pay a little less and some a little more. If ARs are not getting paid within these ranges, please bring it to our attention:

9v9: \$25 11v11: \$30-40 U15+ 11v11: \$40-50

In an effort to clarify what each club is paying for ARs we have asked them to let us know exactly what their club is paying if it's different than the suggested amounts. Below is what we've been told to be true. If there are ever any discrepancies, please bring it to our attention and we will contact the club.

Center Referee Pay


Below are instructions for signing up on the NISL, IWSL and YSSL referee sites for score reporting in those leagues. NISL pays via GOPay in gameofficials.net on a regular basis. See the W-9 section for sending a W-9 to them and sign up for GoPay on gameofficials.net. IWSL and YSSL each pay twice per season; midway through the season and at the end of the season. Please be sure to sign up on the sites as soon as you know you'll be working a match that they pay. You must sign up on the leagues site (or GO group in the case of NISL) and report the score of the match in order for the league to pay you. The score reporting steps and registration are basically the same for YSSL and IWSL, but two separate websites.

For NISL, we don't assign the matches to you in gameofficials.net in the NISL group until after the match is complete. This could sometimes take some time (and typically happens the Monday after the match) so please don't email asking why you can't report the score until we've had a chance to assign the match to you. The reason we wait until after the match is so you don't get duplicate notifications regarding the match. That would cause too much confusion.

If you are a center referee for a competitive league match please make sure that the ARs get paid at every match that we assign unless it is a match paid via GoPay (see below). We will pay ARs for clubs that pay via GoPay at the end of the season. NISL pays Championship league matches separately through GoPay when they pay centers.

NISL Registration

If you are assigned any match that NISL pays the referee (any center and ARs for Championship League) you will need to join the NISL Game Officials group. You may have already been added to the NISL group if you were already a member of our group when NISL created their group. If you are already a member you will see it listed under "Group" on the "My Assignors" page. This is where you will need to go to switch between assignors.



If you are not already a member of the group you need to add yourself to the group by clicking "(Show)" on the "Join New Group" line. Here you can enter the Group Number (1444) and access code (NISL2015) for NISL:





You can then switch back and forth between the NISL group and our group Midwest Referee. NISL is not allowing self-assign so we will continue to use the Midwest Referee group for assigning. **Make sure to always switch back to Midwest Referee to self-assign your matches.**

Make sure your personal information is up to date in Game Officials. This is what NISL will use to pay officials. You can even sign up for direct deposit through Game Officials if this is something you desire.


NISL Score Reporting

If you are not already a member of the NISL group, please see the document for joining. If you center a NISL match you will need to report the score to get paid. We will continue to use the Midwest Referee group for assigning because it allows officials to request and self-assign matches. To avoid the confusion of multiple emails, some of which may have old field assignments, we will wait until after your match to assign the match within the NISL group for score reporting. Once the match is assigned to you in the NISL group you will need to report the score (within 48 hours of the match per NISL request). First you will need to switch to the NISL group listed under "Group" on the "My Assignors" page.




After you click "Switch" next to the NISL group you will need to click on "After Games" under Personal Info.





Find the match you need to report and click on the game number:



Enter the match score and click the "SAVE (Modify Game Details)" button:



Once all matches scores are reported you can then switch back to the Midwest Referee group via the first screen in this document. NISL is not allowing self-assign so we will continue to use the Midwest Referee group for assigning. **Make sure to always switch back to Midwest Referee to self-assign your matches.**






Process is the same for both; Screen shots are from IWSL. Click "Submit Referee Game Card" link on the main page

Enter any guest player pass numbers, enter the score and click Add Referee Game







Self-Assign

Once you are logged in, click the Self-Assign link in the left menu.




You will be taken to the list of games that should look similar to this:






You may need to open Game Filters and modify the dates shown by selecting Custom Dates:




Enter your custom range in the Start and End dates and click reload:





You can also click any of the other custom filters (age and location area are both very useful) and selecting the filter in the dialog that displays:



You can remove the filter by clicking the icon to the right of the filter:




You can click the referee positions (Center, AR1, AR2) on the right side of any match to sign yourself up for the match:






Once you're assigned you will see your name and the ability to remove yourself from the match.



You can remove yourself up to 5 days before the match if something comes up. We never want to have a match not covered so if it's within 5 days please do email so we can get the match covered. Please don't find a replacement and leave yourself assigned. If you do find a replacement that is great, but please send an email to us to make the switch. We need to make sure that the person signed up is the person working the match.

My Matches

You can always view all of the matches you are assigned to by clicking My Games in the left navigation:





Match Information



Click the "I" icon next to a match to get more information about the match, including driving directions on google maps. There are also multiple assignors using Midwest Referee so here is where you can look to see who the assignor is to contact in case of any issues.



Match Calendar Item

You can use the icons on the left of each match to manually export a calendar item for each match

You can then import them into your favorite calendaring tool. Google calendars are great for this (http://calendar.google.com).

There are also reports that you can run to get calendar item for your full season... more to come.



Custom Filters

You can create a custom filter by opening game filters and clicking on the "Create Custom Filters" link:


Click on the filter you want to create. For instance, you can create filters to only show matches in a particular Location Area or to separate recreational from competitive league matches. See following pages for examples and usage.


Location Area Filter

To only show matches in locations you would like to referee, click



Note: Location Area is much broader than Complex or Location; Location areas are typically cities.

Give the filter a name (ie. "My Area") and then select the locations that are convenient for you. Save the filter.





League Filter

To separate recreation from competitive leagues, click on the "Add New League Filter" link:

Custom Filters allow you to create a group of items into a single named list. Once you have created a named list, you will be able to select that item in the corresponding dropdown in the Game Filters box.

For example, if you set up an item called "My Leagues" that contains "League A", "League B", and "League C". When you go to the League Filter, you will see "@ My Leagues" listed in the dropdown. If you select this and Reload the page, the list of Games will include any applicable games from Leagues A, B, and C.




Give the filter a name and select the leagues you would like to include:





Using Filters

Once you save the filters you can use them in the game filters. Click the text "Location Area":



Select the Location Area filter or a specific Location Area:



You should see your selection next to Location Area:




Note: you can use the red icon to the right to quickly remove the filter.

Always click "Reload" to see the filtered results. Keep in mind when you select this filter you will only see matches in these locations.

Use the same process to filter by other categories (ie. League). See below.







You will see the filter you have selected displayed and can clear it by clicking on the icon next to it.



IFAB Laws of the Game

The laws of the game are always changing to meet the demands of the game. To see the latest laws of the game, including any recent changes, please go to the IFAB (International Football Association Board) website here:

We highly recommend downloading the IFAB app on your iPhone or Android device. You can find it on the website or simply search "IFAB" in your app store on your phone. The rules are very nicely laid out and the changes are all explained separately.





Notes from past Referee Meeting

Most important first thing to work on as an AR: Always stay with the 2nd to last defender or ball; whichever is closer to the goal line

Arrive 20 minutes before the match; if it's 15 minutes before the match we'll receive a phone call if refs aren't there What to wear

Black ref socks - pulled up to knee

Black ref Shorts

Undershirt - always tuck in shirts when you put referee shirt on

Don't wear your team/club gear if you can avoid it

You can wear black warm up pants if it's really cold; shorts when warm enough

Multiple thin layers are better than a bulky heavy sweatshirt

Black shoes or soccer shoes

Bring

Your bag with at least 3 jerseys

Your badge

Flags

A Whistle (ARs should also bring one in case the referee has a problem)

Red/Yellow Cards

Black book w/ Game Cards

Coin

Watch (2 if you want to be official)

Pencils/Pens

What to do when you arrive

Check goals/nets

Check field - Corner flags must be 5 feet high

Ask coaches for player cards and game cards

Review rules on game cards

Referee meeting to discuss any procedures (often is done after captains)

Set watch to match half time

Check players in

Greet and introduce

Give instructions and check equipment - shin guards; cleats; no jewelry

Check player passes

Call for captains

Make sure home team brings a ball

Introduce - shake hands

Check ball and show and allow visiting team to inspect; keep for kickoff

Record captain numbers

Identify home team; visiting team calls coin

Toss coin - should catch it and turn

Winning team chooses goal to attack (or ball with new IFAB laws)

Other team has 1st half kickoff (or chooses side if ball chosen by coin toss winner)

Tell them to tell their coaches and we'll start in a minute

All referees walk to center carrying the ball

Place ball in center circle

All referees shake hands



ARs move into position (can run to goals to recheck nets then into position)
ARs Unfurl flags when players are counted and goalkeeper looks ready
Start watch when center starts match with whistle

Centers

Loud whistle

Left wing diagonal - move around on the field; not just from one side of center circle to other Keep players in front of you, but be close to the play

ARs

Stay with the second to last defender (gk is defender)
Watch down the whole line - Attention to touchline when ball is near it
Peripheral vision
Flag should always be closest to field/referee

Crisp signals
Wait and see on offside
Just relax and have fun
Don't be shy - you are in charge
Be nice to coaches and they will work with you to help
Younger kids (U7-U9) will need some help
Generally - never touch the ball; except for a pk or drop ball; or in the case of young kids needing help
